Aaron - Moses' older brother, the first high priest. According to the genealogical lists he was third in descent from Levi (Ex. 6:16–20; 1 Ch. 6:1–3). [FEB 2013]

Abiding - The meaning of this Greek term is thus clearly indicated as that which remains, dwells, continues, tarries, or endures; it is what abides in the position in which it is placed. In reference to spiritual reality the word abide indicates a constancy in relation to Christ. [DEC 2017]

Abomination of Desolation - Matthew 24:15 - 20, "So when you see standing in the holy place 'the abomination that causes desolation,' [NOV 2011]

Abrahamic Covenant – "I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you." This is the beginning of the covenant with Abram. [FEB 2012]

Absalom - David's third son by Maachah daughter of Talmai king of Geshur (a small country between Hermon and Bashan). [FEB 2013]

Abiding Life - Theologians call this topic Menology, because it is largely derived from the Greek Word MENO. There are several meanings for this word. to remain; to stay; to live; to focus; to reside; to endure; to be steadfast and unwavering; to be consistently occupied with someone or something. [FEB 2021]

Acts Outline – outline of the book of Acts. [NOV 2003]

Acts, A Historical Background – chronology and political situation in the time of the apostles. [MAR 2004]

Acts, Introduction to – an introduction to the Acts of the Apostles. [NOV 2003]

Acts, Survey - The book of Acts stands out as unique among the New Testament books for it alone provides a bridge for the other books of the New Testament. [NOV 2003]

Adam - It is fitting that we start with Adam, because Adam was the first head of the human race. By looking at Adam's life we can discover the beginnings of our problems... and solutions. [APR 2006]

Amalekites - Amalek was the son of Eliphaz and grandson of Esau (Gen. 36:12, 16), and as a collective noun, the Amalekites, were his descendants. [FEB 2013]

Ambassadorship - Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ. [NOV 2003]

Amen – brief discussion of the etymology of the word "Amen" and it's usage by believers. [FEB2021]

Amorites - The name Amorite is used in the OT to denote (1) the inhabitants of Palestine generally, (2) the population of the hills as opposed to the plain, and (3) a specific people under a king of their own. [Feb 2013]

Amos - A prophet of the 8th cent B.C., and the third book of the Minor Prophets. [APR 2015]

Anabasis –Xenophon, the *March of the 10,000*. The most famous work, in seven books, of the Greek professional soldier and writer Xenophon. The journey it narrates is his best known accomplishment and "one of the great adventures in human history." [AUG 2011]

Angels - Angels are spiritual beings created by God to serve Him, though created higher than man. Some, the good angels, have remained obedient to Him and carry out His will, while others, fallen angels, disobeyed, fell from their holy position, and now stand in active opposition to the work and plan of God. [MAY 2008]

Anger - What the Bible says about anger, ours and God's. How to deal with sinful anger. [APR 2015]

Anthropology - As a modern science in secular education Anthropology is treated wholly apart from Biblical revelation, having in view only man's development and achievements. Biblical Anthropology enters a much wider field, then, and contemplates important considerations. [DEC 2017]

Antichrist - In the Church Age, antichrist refers to any believer who resides and functions in the world system of Satan. [APR 2004]

Antinomianism - Antinomianism is the view that Christians are exempt from the demands of the moral law by reason of their reliance upon divine grace alone for salvation. [FEB 2013]

Antioch - where followers of Christ were first called Christians, is located some three hundred miles north of Jerusalem, on the west bank of the Orontes River. [FEB2013]

Apocrypha and other non-Canonical Writings - The word Apocrypha means "hidden," or "secret." The term

"Apocrypha" is usually applied to a collection of books, from eleven to sixteen in number, which appeared during the interim between the Old and New Testaments. These books have come down to us in more or less close connection with the canonical books of the Bible. [DEC 2012]

Apollos - a short account of what the Bible has to say about this friend of the apostle Paul. [JAN 2012]

Apostleship - Qualifications, credentials, and function of apostles. [JAN 2012]

Apostolic Age - The apostolic period extends from the Day of Pentecost to the death of St. John, and covers about seventy years, from AD 30 to 100. [FEB 2012]

Apostolic Church – the origins and early days of the Church. [NOV 2003]

Apostolic Fathers – at least a partial listing, including brief biographies of the successors to the Apostles. [FEB 2013]

Aquila and Priscilla - two friends of Paul whom he met in Corinth, who traveled to Ephesus with him, and were instructors of Apollos. [JAN 2012]

Aramaic Language - Aramaic is a language or group of languages of the Semitic family, closely related to Hebrew. Biblical Aramaic, formerly called Chaldee, is the name given to the Aramaic occasionally found in the Old Testament. [FEB 2013]

Areopagus - The Areopagus is a hill northwest of the Acropolis in Athens, Greece, where the apostle Paul preached to the intellectuals. [FEB 2013]

Arianism - a nontrinitarian belief that asserts that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, but is entirely distinct from and subordinate to the God the Father. [NOV 2015]

Ark of the Covenant – The Ark of the Tabernacle, its history and typology. [FEB 2013]

Armageddon – a review of the final battle. [FEB 2012]

Armor of God - An exposition of Eph. 6:10 - 17; a discussion of demon organization and tactics; history of Roman armor to explain vocabulary. [OCT 2011]

Armor of God, Using the – "If training in arms ceases, there is no difference between a soldier and a civilian! and No matter how many years he has served, an unexercised solder is a raw recruit!" – Vegetius [Dec 2012]

Assyria – the relationship of this ancient empire to God's people; God's dealing with the Assyrians. [FEB 2012]

Augustus (Octavian) – a brief biography of the Roman Emperor who sent out the decree at the time of Jesus' birth that "all the world" should be taxed. [NOV 2011]

Authority, God's Chain of Command - Authority of God as delegated to the apostles, and from the apostles to us via the Scriptures; proper responses to civil, ecclesiastical, and family authority. [FEB 2012]

Baal - The supreme fertility-god of the Canaanites. [FEB 2013]

Babel, Tower of - The popular designation of the tower (Heb migdol) described in Gen. 11, which people migrating from the East built in the midst of their city in the plain of Shinar [SEPT 2012]

Babylon - Babylon lay on the bank of the Euphrates in the land of Shinar (Gen. 10:10), in the northern area of Babylonia (now southern Iraq) called Accad (as opposed to the southern area called Sumer). [MAR 2013]

Babylonia – detailed ancient history of the Babylonian empire, by George Rawlinson, MA, from *The Seven Great Monarchies of the Ancient Eastern World.* [AUG 2014]

Balaam - Short description of Balaam's career with reference to the Doctrine of Balaam

Berea - When they were driven out of Thessalonica, Paul and Silas came to Berea, where they preached in the synagogue of the Jews [SEPT 2012]

Berenice – the sister of Herod Agrippa II; features in trial of Paul in Acts 25 [SEPT 2012]

Bethlehem - Judah - The home of Ruth and Boaz, the city of David, the birthplace of Jesus Christ. [JULY 2015]

Bible Exegesis and Exposition · This article gives a method for moving from exegesis to expository preaching. (Chester McCalley)

Bible Study Principles - How to study and understand the Bible [SEPT 2012]

Crete, Brief History - An outline history of Crete and historical comments on the character of the people; a historical supplement to the study of the Epistle to Titus

 $\pmb{\text{Crowns}}$ - the time and place of reward and crowns in the Christian life. [DEC 2017]

Cyprus - An island situated near the northeast corner of the Mediterranean Sea, in angle formed by the coasts of Cilicia (modern Turkey) and Syria. [AUG 2014]

Cyrus the Great - Properly Cyrus II, the Great, founder of the Persian empire. He reigned from 559 to 530 B.C., and his empire flourished until its conquest by Alexander the Great (331 B.C.). [MAR 2013]

Damascus - an outline study of this oldest city in the world; of central interest to Bible events. [JULY 2015]

Disciples, The Twelve – brief biographies of the Twelve. [JULY 2015]

Dispensations - A dispensation is a period of time which is identified by its relation to some particular purpose of God. [JULY 2015]

Dispersion - The term used to designate the Jews living outside Palestine and maintaining their religious observances and customs among the Gentiles. [FEB 2013]

Divine Decree - The classic definition comes from R.B. Thieme, Jr.: "The decree of God is His eternal (always existed), holy (perfect integrity), wise (the application of omniscience to creation), and sovereign purpose, comprehending simultaneously all things that ever were or will be in their causes, conditions (status), successions (interaction with others that leads to certain decisions), relations, and determining their certain futurition."

Divine Discipline, the Five Cycles of - Whom the Lord loves, He chastens, whether it is an individual, a city or community, or a nation. [NOV 2015]

Divine Guidance - How to determine the will of God. [JULY 2015]

Ecumenical Council - An ecumenical council is a conference of ecclesiastical dignitaries and theological experts convened to discuss and settle matters of Church doctrine and practice in which those entitled to vote are convoked from the whole world (οικυμενει) and which secures the approbation of the whole Church. [NOV 2015]

Edification - the doctrine of growing in the knowledge of Jesus Christ, leading to productivity in the Christian way of life. [JULY 2015]

Edomites - Historical summary of the Edomites. [JULY 2015]

Egypt, Herodotus - Among Herodotus' descriptions of countries the most fascinating to the modern reader, as it was to the ancient, is his account of the marvels of the land of Egypt. [JULY 2015]

Egypt, History of – a thoroughly researched study by George Rawlinson, from *The Seven Great Monarchies of the Ancient Eastern World.* [AUG 2014]

Elders - elders (or bishops) are the divinely ordered rulers in the local, visible church. [DEC 2017]

Eternal Life - Three stages of everlasting life, "now" and "forever". [JULY 2015]

Eternal Security - An understanding of these concepts is required before there can be stability in our Christian lives. [JULY 2015]

Eternity - We don't know much in detail about eternity, what it's like, or what we will be doing there. However, the Bible does have some information from which we can draw some inferences. [JULY 2015]

Evangelism - Evangelism is the act of presenting to the unsaved the evangel or good news of the gospel of God's saving grace through Christ Jesus. [DEC 2017]

Evangelism-True (Chafer) - Full study of Lewis Sperry Chafer's work on Evangelism. [APR 2021]

Eucharist (Lord's Supper) – The history of the Relationship of the Passover to the Lord's Supper. [JULY 2015]

Eusebius of Caesarea – one of the most important Nicene and post-Nicene fathers, the "father of church history," the Christian Herodotus. [OCT 2014]

Evil, Doctrine of - A thorough study of the doctrines related to Satan's strategy, his attempt to discredit the Lord Jesus Christ during the Church Age. [JULY 2015]

Exhort-Rebuke-Preach - Christians are commanded to "exhort" one another. Sometimes that calls for a comforting ministry, and sometimes it calls for straight talk. [APR 2015]

Exorcism - Exorcisms are acts of liberating afflicted persons from the influence of demons. [JULY 2015]

Ezra - Ezra returned to Jerusalem with a group of repatriates and others in the seventh year of Artaxerxes. [MAR 2013]

Faith - Faith as a means of learning compared to rationalism and empiricism; how Christian faith works; how to grow in faith. [JULY 2015]

Faith, Abraham's Tests - Abraham's faith in the promises of God was tested at least twelve times. [NOV 2021]

Faith - Rest - The practice of enjoying the peace of God. How to claim promises; how to be stable and relaxed; how to enjoy happiness that doesn't depend on people, circumstances or things. [JULY 2015]

Faith Rest Drill, The - A Christian must prepare himself in advance for the time when severe testing occurs. [FEB 2021]

Faithfulness of God - The faithfulness of God to the believer is expressed in many ways in the Bible. [JULY 2015]

Faith-Rest and a Christian's Mental Stability – doctrinal study which leads to a relaxed mental attitude. [IULY 2015]

False Prophet, The - The False Prophet of the end times. [APR 2015]

Felix Antonius - A Roman procurator of Judea, appointed by the emperor Claudius. Dealt with Paul in Caesarea. [JULY 2015]

Fellowship, Christian - Four areas of relationship for believers in a local church: doctrine, fellowship, breaking of bread, prayer. [JULY 2015]

Festus - The Roman governor or procurator who succeeded FELIX ANTONIUS in the province of Judea (Acts 24:27). [AUG 2014]

Forgiveness - The test of Grace living is a forgiving spirit. [JULY 2015]

Phoenicia, History of – a thoroughly researched study by George Rawlinson, from *The Seven Great Monarchies of the Ancient Eastern World.* [AUG 2014]

Pilate - Pontius Pilate was the fifth governor of the Roman province of Judea. His rule began in 26 AD and lasted until early in 37 AD. [JULY 2015]

Pilgrim Church, The – by E. H. Broadbent. A concise history of the Church compared with the principles taught in the New Testament. [DEC 2017]

Pilgrim's Progress – "From This World To That Which Is To Come, Delivered under the similitude of a dream", BY JOHN BUNYAN

Plan of God - God's plan is ultimately to sum up all things in Christ, to use all of the created universe to physically and spiritually manifest the glory of His Son. This includes you and me. [JULY 2015]

Predestination - How the word "predestination" is used in the Bible. [JULY 2015]

Pride (Arrogance) - Whenever a Christian fails to execute the plan of God for his life, sinful pride is the primary reason and motivating cause. [JULY 2015]

Priesthood, The Officiating (Edersheim) - Among the most interesting glimpses of early life in the church is that afforded by a small piece of rapidly-drawn scenery which presents to our view 'a great company of the priests,' 'obedient to the faith' (Acts 6:7). [JULY 2015]

Privacy - Privacy is that principle of freedom whereby an individual has the right to retire from the company of others, remaining in seclusion from the knowledge or observation of others. [JULY 2015]

Prophets and Prophesying - An outline study of the Old Testament Prophet and his ministry. [4/96]

Propitiation - Jesus Christ is our Mercy Seat, our place of propitiation!

Proselytes - A proselyte was any non-Jew who lived among the Jews. [JULY 2015]

Prosperity - Prosperity can come to the believer through three sources. [NOV 2021]

Psalms, Introduction to - An introduction to the study of the Psalms, and an outline of the First Psalm. [JULY 2015]

Purity - The apostle Paul told Timothy, "Keep yourself pure..." Good advice for all of us. A study of KATHAROS. [JULY 2015]

Puteoli - A maritime city of Campania in Italy where Paul landed on his voyage to Rome; the modern name is Pozzuoli. [AUG 2014]

Pythagoras – a brief biography of the Greek mathematician, Born: about 569 BC in Samos, Ionia. [JULY 2015]

Qualifications for Ministers - an exposition of Titus 1:5-9. [JULY 2015]

Rabbinical Exegesis –from Talmud scholars, a brief description of the rules to be observed in deducing Halakhah (Jewish law) from the texts of Scripture. [JULY 2015]

Rabbinical Schools - Until the formation of the later Rabbinical colleges, which flourished after the Jews were driven from Jerusalem, the instruction in the divinity schools seems to have been chiefly oral. [JULY 2015]

Rahab and the Grace of God - Rahab, Salmon's wife, Ruth's mother - in - law, David's great - great grandmother, a trophy to the Grace of God. [JULY 2015]

Rapture - A description of the carrying away of believers at the end of the Church Age; a comparison between Rapture and Second Coming events. [JULY 2015]

Reconciliation - How God the Father changes (reconciles) us to His own standards and righteousness. [JULY 2015]

Red Heifer Offering - When a person became ceremonially unclean by some contact with an unclean

animal or person or by contact with a dead person, he was required to go through a ritual cleansing. [JULY 2015]

Redeeming the Time - A Christian is obliged to make the most of time here on earth, living with eternity's values in view. [JULY 2015]

Redemption - A study of the doctrine of redemption, God's special intervention for the salvation of mankind. [JULY 2015]

Refreshment - Romans 15:32 says, "So that by God's will I may come to you with joy and together with you be refreshed."

Regeneration - What does it mean to be born again? A discussion of the words referring to a believer's new life in Christ. [JULY 2015]

Religions of the World - The major non - Christian religions of the world, including Hinduism, Islam, Buddhism, Jainism, Shinto, Zoroastrianism, Taoism, and Confucianism. [JULY 2015]

Repentance - "Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Responsibility – the present responsibilities of those who wait for the Kingdom of Christ. [JULY 2015]

Restoration of the lews -

Resurrection of Christ - An outline study of the main features of the resurrection of Christ, including a description of the resurrection body of Christ and the events surrounding the resurrection. [JULY 2015]

Rhodes - The capital city of Rhodes is mentioned in Acts 21:1 as one of Paul's stopping places on his final journey to Jerusalem. Though the port city had once been one of the most powerful commercial centers of the Mediterranean, by the time of Paul's visit it was little more than a beautiful city with a glorious past. [JULY 2015]

Roads - Jerusalem to Damascus - a description of the roads Paul probably traveled from Jerusalem to Damascus. [JULY 2015]

Rock, Jesus Christ the - Scriptures referring to Jesus Christ as the Rock. [JULY 2015]

Roman Army, Soldier Training – from Vegetius, *Epitome of Military Science.* [JULY 2015]

Roman Commerce - Great development had been given to commerce by the consolidation of the Roman Empire. [AUG 2014]

Roman History - An outline history of the period of time leading up to the birth of Christ; The Republic, the Punic Wars, the rise of the Caesars; the city of Rome in New Testament times; the Catacombs. [JULY 2015]

Roman Kings – a list of the men who ruled Rome from its founding in 754 BC until the beginning of the Roman Republic. [JULY 2015]

Roman Law - The source of Roman law is the family or gens. The proprietary rights of the pater familias as head of this primitive unit of organization are fundamental in private law, and the scope of the criminal jurisdiction of the state was limited by the power of life and death exercised by the head of the family over those under his authority. [MAR 2013]

Roman Names - The names of Roman citizens had four parts. Paul's Roman name was Saulus Benjaminus Tarsus Paulus. [JULY 2015]

Roman Persecution - an extended account of the persecution of Christians by the Romans, and details of the siege and destruction of Jerusalem in 70 AD. [JULY 2015]

Roman Provincial System - from the time when Augustus united the world under his own power, the provinces were divided into two different classes

Rome, City of, in Bible Times – what was the city of Rome like in the times of the early church?

Salamis - the city on Cyprus, visited by Paul and Barnabas. Traditional place where Barnabas, a native of Cyprus, was martyred. [JULY 2015]

Salvation Doctrines - Teaching about our union with Christ; and a listing, with verses, of more than 50 basic doctrines of the Bible which describe all that happens to a believer at the moment of salvation. [JAN 2015]

Salvation in the Old Testament - How people got saved before the death of Christ on the Cross. [JULY 2015]

Samaria – a brief but thorough political history of Samaria. [JULY 2015]

Samaritan Woman – an exposition of John 4:1-42. [JULY 2015]

Samos - When Paul "touched" here after passing Chios on returning from his third missionary journey (Acts 20:15), Samos was a "free city" in the province of Asia. [JULY 2015]

Samson - From Commentary on the Old Testament, Leviticus 13 to 16, by C. F. Keil and F. Delitzsch. [MAR 2013]

Samuel – Introduction to the books of Samuel, from *Commentary on the Old Testament,* by C. F. Keil and F. Delitzsch [MAR 2013]

Sanctification – Sanctification is a state of separation unto God; all believers enter into this state when they are born again. There are three phases of sanctification: Positional, Experiential, and Ultimate Sanctification. [APR 2015]

Sanctification ISBE – a scholarly, in-depth study of the biblical concept of sanctification, written by G. W. Bromiley, in the International Standard Bible Encyclopedia. [APR 2015]

Sanhedrin – brief description of this ruling body. [JULY 2015]

Sassanians, The – The New Persians. A thoroughly researched study by George Rawlinson, from *The Seven Great Monarchies of the Ancient Eastern World.* [AUG 2014]

Satan - What the Bible says about Satan and his strategies. [JULY 2015]

Saul - The son of Kish of the tribe of Benjamin, the first king of Israel. [JULY 2015]

Second Advent of Christ - The first was at the birth of the only-begotten Son of God, and the objective of the first advent was to provide salvation for all mankind. The second advent will display the Royalty and Glory of our Lord, and at that time He will fulfill all the covenants to Israel. [JULY 2015]

Sects and Parties of the Jews – a description of the various Jewish parties in the time of Christ, including Pharisees, Sadducees, Hellenists, Arameans. [JULY 2015]

Self-Deception - by Paton James Gloag, minister of the Parish of Dunning, Blantyre and Galashiels, early 20th century. "The greatest care and caution are necessary in examining the evidences of our conversion. We ought to exercise a holy jealousy over ourselves, and to avoid arriving at any definite conclusion as to the safety of our condition, except on sure and scriptural grounds."

Sennacherib - King of Assyria and Babylonia (705–681 B.C.), son of Sargon II and father of Esarhaddon. He besieged Jerusalem in the days of Hezekiah. [JULY 2015]

Separation - A Christian lives in the world, but is not "of" it. [JULY 2015]

Septuagint - Septuagint (sometimes abbreviated LXX) is the name given to the Greek translation of the Jewish Scriptures. [JULY 2015]

Sergius Paulus – the Roman official whom Paul and Barnabas met in Cyprus on their first missionary journey. [JULY 2015]

Servants and Slaves - A description of the condition and treatment of servants and slaves in Bible times. [JULY 2015]

Servants of God - God commands Christians to be faithful and obedient servants. [JULY 2015]

Sexual Promiscuity - Extensive study of what the Bible says about non - marital sexual activity. [JULY 2015]

Shepherds of the Flock of God - the qualifications and duties of spiritual shepherds; Jehovah as Shepherd; Jesus Christ as the Good Shepherd. [Aug 1995]

Shi'ites and Sunnis – a comparison of the Islamic Shi'ite and Sunni beliefs and practices, along with a comparison of Islam with conservative Christianity. [JULY 2015]

Ships and Navigation – the ships and navigation techniques of ancient times, especially relating to the vovages of Paul. [AUG 2014]

Sidon - A city-state on the Mediterranean coast, 40 km (25 mi) N of Tyre, the modern city of Şaida'. [AUG 2014]

Sin Nature - Sin Nature: part of the essence of the soul acquired at Adam's fall and passed on to every person at birth. [JULY 2015]

Sin Unto Death - The final stage of divine discipline, with examples. [JULY 2015]

Sin, Doctrine of - a comprehensive topical study of the Doctrine of Sin. [MAR 2015]

Sin, Greek Words – the Greek words for all the sins mentioned in the New Testament. [JULY 2015]

Sins of the Tongue - One of the worst sins; how to recognize it; how to have victory! [MAR 2015]

Slander - This teaching from Proverbs 26 gives us a lot of insight into the mentality of the "fool" who is one of those people known as a "talebearer". {MAR 2015]

Solomon - Son of David and third king of Israel. [JULY 2015]

Soul, The - Man is aware of his own existence and is able to relate to both animate and inanimate life on earth. [JULY 2015]

Speaking in Tongues – The prophesy that people would speak in tongues began with Isaiah, when he was warning the Southern Kingdom that they were about to be destroyed. [FEB 2015]

Spiritual Gifts - God has a purpose in life for each and every believer. He provides divine enabling for carrying out that purpose. [APR 2015]

Spirituality and Carnality – at any given time, a Christian is either filled with the Holy Spirit (in fellowship), or not. He is either spiritual or carnal. [JULY 2015]

Standing - The advanced Christian, the person who has "attained to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ," has completed basic preparation, is **standing** firm, and is ready to be promoted into mature production in the Lord. [JULY 2015]

Stephen – an excellent study of the life and ministry of the first martyr. [JULY 2015]

Stoicism - the only direct reference to the Stoics in the Bible occurs in Acts 17:18, where Paul is reported to have addressed Epicurean and Stoic philosophers in Athens. [JULY 2015]

Substitution - The unlimited substitutionary atonement for sin. Christ bore our sins in His own body... [JULY 2015]

Suetonius, The Twelve Caesars

Suffering - A discussion of the suffering experienced by believers and unbelievers; deserved and undeserved suffering; how to avoid some forms of suffering; suffering for blessing. [JULY 2015]

Synagogues - from Alfred Edersheim, *Sketches of Jewish Social Life*, Chapters 16 and 17; also from Conybeare and Howson, *The Life and Epistles of St. Paul*. [JULY 2015]

Syracuse - A city on the east coast of Sicily, about midway between Catania and the southeastern extremity of the island; Paul stopped there three days on his voyage from Malta to Rome (Acts 28:12). [AUG 2014]

Tabernacle Furniture - A description of function and typology of the laver, candlesticks, table of bread, altar of incense, veil, and ark of the covenant. [JULY 2015]

Talmud, Categories of Work – The thirty-nine categories of the Law making up the basis for Sabbath laws regarding work. [JULY 2015]

Talmud, Erubin - How can Israelites on the Sabbath move about from one private domain to another? By use of an *erub*, symbolic food that legally commingles privately owned domains. [JULY 2015]

Talmud, History - The name "Talmud" means "teaching" or "study" and refers to the oral law which has been taught to the children of Israel since the time of Moses. [JULY 2015]

Talmud, On Christ - what the Talmud teaches about Jesus Christ, the founder of Christianity; and about his followers, the Christians. [JULY 2015]

Talmud, Organization of - The rabbis of the 2nd and 3rd centuries after Christ organized the Talmud in the form we find it today. [JULY 2015]

Talmud, Structure of the - The rabbis of the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} centuries after Christ organized the Talmud in the form we find it today. [JULY 2015]

Talmud, Tractate Shabbat – the portion of the Talmud dealing with Sabbath categories of work. (Order Moed, Tractate Shabbat, Chapter 7)

Teaching in the Local Church - A study of the mission of the local church with respect to "feeding the flock". [JULY 2015]

Temple, Description and Measurement – from Edersheim, Alfred, "Sketches of Jewish Social Life", Appendix I. [JULY 2015]

Temple, Destruction- 70 AD, the destruction of Jerusalem resulted also in the destruction of the Temple. [JULY 2015]

Temple, Development – the history of the building of Herod's Temple. [JULY 2015]

Texas Declaration of Independence - ...on the 2nd day of March, 1836. [MAR 2021]

Theology and Biblical Criticism

Thessalonica - the second city in Europe to hear the preaching voice of St. Paul, and probably the first church to receive an epistle from him. [JULY 2015]

Thorns - Thorns are associated with the curse of mankind and nature at the time of the Fall. Man has to contend with thorns in his work and in his spiritual life. [JULY 2015]

Thyatira – location of one of the seven local churches of Revelation; home of Lydia, the seller of purple. [JULY 2015]

Timothy – brief biography of Timothy, the companion of Paul. [JULY 2015]

Traditionalism – Jewish traditions; Origin, Character, And Literature; The Mishnah And Talmud

Trinity - The doctrine of the trinity recognizes God as being one in essence but three persons who possess equal, perfect, eternal and infinite identical essence. [JULY 2015]

Troas - On the second missionary journey, Paul and Silas came to Troas after being forbidden to preach the Word of God in Asia (Acts 16:6). [SEPT 2012]

Truth - The Word of God is Truth; examples of eagerness for God's truth. [SEPT 2012]

Twelve Caesars – brief biographies of the first twelve emperors of the Roman Empire, by Suetonius. [FEB 2013]

Twelve Tribes of Israel - All these are the twelve tribes of Israel, and this is what their father said to them when he blessed them. He blessed them, every one with the blessing appropriate to him (Gen. 49:28). [SEPT 2012]

Tyre - When Paul and Barnabas traveled from Antioch to Jerusalem, they went through Phoenicia to tell the believers how God had brought Gentiles to faith (Acts 15:3). [SEPT 2012]

Uncleanness in the Levitical System - Notes on the concept of ceremonial uncleanness in the Old Testament Jewish system. [OCT 2013]

Union (DAVAQ) - a study of the Hebrew word DAVAQ, "union". [OCT 2013]

Widows – In the New Testament, a widow is a woman who has lost her husband by death or is divorced from her husband. [OCT 2013]
