To Warren,


Greetings from Ikelenge in North Western Province of Zambia. I hope that you and the family including the ministry are fine.

Before discussing the main issue, let me say something about Ikelege District and our source of income. One of the main source of livelihood in the district is pineapple farming. In the recent past, a company launched a Pineapple Factory in Ikelenge after the collapse of the only pineapple processing factory in 1991. There are more than 500 pineapple farmers in the district; lack of enough pineapple processing and storage facilities is hampering the growth of the fruit factory. We have been calling upon investors to set up more pineapple processing plants because most of the produce is currently going to waste. Ikelenge is an ideal location for pineapple processing activities because the district produces more fruit than any other area in the North-western Province. As Grace Notes Class, we have been trying to raise funds to purchase a pineapple processing machine but we have failed because the machine is quite expensive. We grow pineapples but it goes to waste because we have no machine to process the fruit into juice so that we can sell. We only sell raw or unprocessed pineapple and this does not give us enough money. On behalf of my fellow students I would like to ask you for your prayers in this regard.

I wish to state that your work of supporting Grace Notes in Ikelenge District is not in vain. We are being transformed in the likeness of Jesus Christ. We are also being sharpened into better instruments for serving God. The last few years we have conducted lessons in schools, we have seen almost 1000 pupils receiving salvation. This is a great achievement.

Our prayer is that you should not grow cold in serving the Lord. The reward is from Him. We may seem to be bothering you financial and sometimes you may get annoyed that beggars are troubling me, please do not grow weary. We are not beggars, we are ask because we want to empower ourselves so that we stand on our own. No normal human being would want to live a life of begging. I thank you.
